
JIE 'N'/JIE 'E' – Joint Intake Exercise

The JIE 'E' is for GCE N(T) students to apply for the 3-year *Nitec* course with Enhanced *Nitec* Foundation Programme.

Details of Admission Exercises



PFP – Polytechnic Foundation Programme

PFP is a one-year programme that offers a practice-oriented curriculum taught by polytechnic lecturers to better prepare polytechnic-bound Secondary 4 N(A) students for entry into selected polytechnic diploma courses. PFP students are given provisional places in diploma programmes, subject to them passing all modules in the one-year programme.

DPP – Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme

DPP allows Secondary 4N(A) students to be admitted directly into selected 2-year Higher Nitec programmes at ITE without having to sit for the O-Level examinations or undergo a Nitec programme. DPP students who successfully complete their Higher Nitec courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course.





NFP – NAFA Foundation Programme

NFP is a one-year practice-based programme that prepares N(A)-Level holders to pursue a diploma in the creative arts. NFP students who successfully complete the programme will be offered a place in their chosen diploma course at NAFA.



- 2. If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered <u>before</u> applying in the **2**nd **Phase** (Late Application/Appeal Phase) between <u>30 Dec 2024 to 3 Jan 2025</u>. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on **10 Jan 2025 at 9am**.
- 3. Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the 3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase) between 10 Jan to 17 Jan 2025 and 23 Jan to 7 Feb 2025 for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between 14 Jan to 23 Jan 2025 and 23 Jan to 13 Feb 2025.



Option 1: Promotion to Sec 5 NA

Criteria:

- Obtained an ELMAB3 aggregate score of 19 points or less (excluding bonus points), <u>and</u>
- At least an N(A)-level Grade 5 for all subjects used in the computation of ELMAB3

Option 2: Progression to Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

What is PFP?

- PFP is a diploma-specific foundation programme conducted over one year.
- Students who pass all modules in the one-year PFP will progress to the first year of the relevant diploma course in the same polytechnic.

Criteria:


- ELMAB3 aggregate score 12 points or less (excluding CCA bonus points) and
- EL,MA ≤ 3
- Met subject-specific entry requirements stated in <u>https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/pfp_eligibility.html</u>



Option 2: Progression to Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

How to apply:

- Following the release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025, eligible students may apply for the PFP online via the PFP portal at https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/pfp application.html

Option 2: Progression to Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

Points to note for application of PFP:

- Students who are only interested in applying for the PFP should first progress to Sec 5N(A), even if they meet the PFP eligibility criteria based on their GCE N(A)-Level results in December 2024.
- They may then apply for the PFP upon release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025.
- If their application is successful, they will withdraw from Sec 5N(A) by the end of January 2025.
- All PFP-bound students are required to attend Sec 5N(A) classes in their secondary schools up till 31 January 2025.

Option 3: Institution of Technical Education (ITE) under Direct-Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

What is DPP?

- Consist of a two-year Higher Nitec courses at ITE.
- DPP students who successfully complete their Higher Nitec courses and attain the minimum qualifying GPA are subsequently guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course.
- Successful applicants will be required to attend a 10-week preparatory course prior to commencing their Higher Nitec courses



Option 3: Institution of Technical Education (ITE) under Direct-Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

Criteria:


- ELMAB3 aggregate score of 19 points or less (excluding CCA bonus points)
 - <u>and</u>
- Met subject-specific entry requirements for each course, as stated in https://www.ite.edu.sg/admissions/full-time-courses/higher-nitec-dpp



Option 3: Institution of Technical Education (ITE) under Direct-Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)


How to apply:

- Following the release of the GCE N(A)-Level results in December 2024, eligible students may apply for the DPP online via the ITE website (https://www.ite.edu.sg/admissions/full-time-courses/higher-nitec-dpp)
- Application opens from Mon 16 Dec 2024 (2.30pm) to Thu 19 Dec 2024 (5pm)




Students who are interested in applying for both the PFP and DPP:

- Students are encouraged to carefully consider their interests and strengths, as well as the courses offered under both programmes.
- One option for students who are interested in both the PFP and DPP is to first progress to Sec 5N(A) and then apply for both the PFP and DPP upon release of the GCE O-Level examination results in January 2025.



Students who are interested in applying for both the PFP and DPP:

- Students who are offered a place in both the PFP and DPP may only accept one course offer. Students who accept both offers will have both offers voided.
- If their application to either the PFP or DPP is successful, they will withdraw from Sec 5N(A) by the end of January 2025.



Students who are interested in applying for both the PFP and DPP:

- For students who have already applied for and accepted their DPP offer prior to the release of the GCE O-Level examination results, their secondary school will contact them to collect the PFP eligibility form (Form P) if they are eligible for PFP after the release of the GCE O-Level results.
- Students who decide to apply for and accept their PFP offer in January 2024 will need to withdraw from the DPP course.
- Applicants can apply for a refund of their DPP enrolment fees, subject to ITE's approval.



Use all 12 JIE choices wisely, as competition for 3-year Higher Nitec courses is keen!

Do consult your teachers / ECG counsellors to help you nake your choices!

Do use the Last Aggregate Score (LAS) published in ITE's admission portal to help you make your course choices. Af you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the Enharced Foundation Programme (EFP).

If you are eligible for EFP, make sure you apply for both the EFP and the 2-year Nitec/3-year Higher Nitec!

The EFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations that will enable you to successfully complete your course!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first before appealing for another course you may be more interested in!

POLYTECHNIC FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (PFP)

Essential Things You Need to Know

1. What is the PFP?

- A foundation year at the polytechnics that:
 - Prepares well-performing Sec 4N(A) students for entry into relevant polytechnic diploma courses
 - Serves as an alternative to Sec 5
- Conducted over two academic semesters at the polytechnics
- Students must pass all PFP modules in order to progress to their respective, pre-selected diploma courses.

2. Am I eligible for PFP 2025?

You are eligible for the PFP if you:

- ☐ Sat for GCE N-Level exams as a school candidate in 2024
- ☐ Have obtained an ELMAB3 aggregate of <u>12 points or</u> <u>less</u> (before deduction of CCA bonus points)
- ☐ Met subject-specific entry requirements as listed on the PFP portal

If you can check all 3 boxes above, you're eligible!

(Note: Eligibility does <u>not</u> guarantee you a place in a PFP course)

If you had offered GCE O-Level examination subjects in 2024, you may refer to this table for the equivalent grade to compute your ELMAB3 aggregate:

3. How do I apply?

- Upon release of the GCE O-Level results, all PFPeligible students will receive Form P containing a PFP PIN that allows them to apply for the PFP at this link.
- You may select up to five course choices.
- Remember to provide updated contact details in your application to allow the polytechnics to contact you if necessary.


(Note: You should continue to attend Sec 5 from 2 January 2025 while applying for PFP.)

4. How will I be informed of the outcome?

- You should log in to the PFP portal to check your application outcomes on the day of PFP posting results release.
- You will then have to indicate if you wish to accept/reject/appeal the offer.
- If you do not select any option, your offer will become invalid and you will be required to continue with your classes in Sec 5/DPP.
 (Note: If your appeal is successful, your original offer will be voided, regardless of whether you accept the new PFP offer.)

5. What happens next?

- If you accept your offer, you will receive an enrolment package from the polytechnic in February/March 2025.

5 Things You Need to Know

1. What is the DPP?

- Prepares Sec 4N(A) students for progression into selected polytechnic diploma courses via a 2-year Higher Nitec programme at ITE, and a 10-week DPP preparatory course > Serves as an alternative to Sec 5
- DPP students who meet the minimum qualifying GPA score are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to the Higher Nitec course. (Refer to https://www.ite.edu.sg/admissions/full-time-courses/highernitec-dpp for course mapping.)
- About 1,200 places offered across 18 Higher Nitec courses

2. Am I eligible for DPP?

- ☐ Sec 4N(A) student who has sat for GCE N-Level exams in 2024
- ☐ Obtained ELMAB3 aggregate of 19 points or less (before deduction of CCA bonus points)
- ☐ Meet course-specific entry requirements
- If you can check all 3 boxes above, you're eligible! (Note: Eligibility does not quarantee placement.)

If you have offered GCE O-Level examination subjects in 2024, you may refer to this table for the equivalent grade to compute your ELMAB3 aggregate:

GCE O-Level Grade	Converted Grade
A1-B3	1
B4-C6	2
D7	3
E8	4

3. How do I apply?

- Oupon release of the GCE N-Level results, all DPP-eligible students may apply for DPP Higher Nitec courses via the ITE website (https://www.ite.edu.sg).
- You may select up to 12 course choices.
- Remember to provide updated contact details in your application so that ITE can contact you if necessary.

4. How will I know the outcome?

- You should check your DPP posting results online on the morning of the release of the DPP posting results.
- You will then have to indicate if you wish to accept/reject/appeal the offer.
- Your offer will be void if you do not accept the offer by the stipulated date. You will be required to continue with your classes in Sec 5, or with your Nitec / Higher Nitec course if your application via JIE 'N' is successful

5. What happens next?

Upon accepting your DPP offer, you will attend a 10-week DPP preparatory programme starting from Jan 2025.


